

Acceptable Forms of ID

Two pieces of ID are required for the **mandatory credit check**.

Only Acceptable Forms of ID

- Canadian driver's license*
- Social insurance number + valid government-issued photo ID
- Major Canadian credit card + valid government-issued photo ID

***IMPORTANT:** You CAN NOT use a driver's license for both Photo ID and Credit check.

Other	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work Visa • Department of Defense ID (Canadian) • Permanent Resident Card • Certificate of Indian Status • CNIB card (Canadian National Institute of the Blind) • NEXUS card (optional, we cannot insist the customer provide us with this form of ID, however, if the customer offers, we can use it to verify the customer's identity.) • Possession and Acquisition License (PAL) 								
Health care card	<p>Some Canadian provinces have strict regulations restricting who can view, record and use a health care card as a form of picture id outside of the medical field.</p> <table border="1"> <thead> <tr> <th>Province</th> <th>Accepted</th> </tr> </thead> <tbody> <tr> <td>British Columbia Prince Edward Island Newfoundland Northwest Territories</td> <td>Yes.
